Week 2: March 1-6

MONDAY: Invitation to Adoration

Receive this Invitation:

While we have all been living through the incredible disruption of this pandemic, this verse reminds us that we can "Worship and Adore" in many different ways. Since the start of the pandemic, St. Paul has recorded and produced new media every week for families to worship safely at home. Since October we have been holding live worship services at 11 am, using everything we know to ensure our services are as safe as possible. On February 28th, we will also be holding the contemporary service in the fellowship hall at 11 am. On March 28th, we will begin the 8:30 traditional service.

Matthew 18:20 shows us that the adoration of God can happen anywhere. The worship of God is not dependent on our place, our dress, the words that we say or the songs we sing. The adoration and worship of God is in the hearts and minds we lift to God, and in the love that we share in the world. I would ask that all members of St. Paul commit to "Worship and Adore" in some way every week during Lent.

As a musician, I've decided that music can serve to help people "Worship and Adore" because it is mostly a combination of poetry and music. Since poetry affects mainly the intellect and music affects mainly the heart, I think music in the service of worship can help to move both the mind and heart to a more profound adoration. I can't say it better than hymn #68 "When in Our Music God is Glorified"

- 1. When in our music God is glorified, and adoration leaves no room for pride, it is as though the whole creation cried, Hallelujah!
- 2. How often, making music, we have found a new dimension in the world of sound, as worship moved us to a more profound Hallelujah!

- 3. So has the church, in liturgy and song, in faith and love, through centuries of wrong, borne witness to the truth in every tongue: Hallelujah!
- 4. And did not Jesus sing a Psalm that night when utmost evil strove against the Light? Then let us sing, for whom he won the fight: Hallelujah!
- 5. Let every instrument be tuned for praise! Let all rejoice who have a voice to raise! And may God give us faith to sing always: Hallelujah! Amen.
