### **MONDAY:** Invitation to Empty

### Receive this Invitation:

It is an awful feeling to pour a bowl of cereal, open the fridge, reach for the milk and find the carton empty. Or make a cup of coffee and realize you have no cream. It's so frustrating, right? It sure seems like a sign of how the rest of your day is going to go.

For most of us running out of groceries is an easy situation to rectify. Shoot, these days you can click or scroll, and someone will deliver it to your front door. But what if you couldn't? What if there were not the funds to simply restock your pantry? What if there was a severe drought that led to a famine? What if you were about to make your last meal with the very last of your supplies?

That is exactly the situation that the woman in 1 Kings 17 finds herself in. The prophet Elijah was directed by the Lord to go to the Kerith Ravine east of the Jordan River. As the drought continued and conditions worsened, God sent Elijah to Sidon (modern day Lebanon) and told him that he would find a widow that would supply him with food. Sidon was a country that did not worship the God of Israel. They worshipped Baal. It seems a strange place for God to send His prophet. An unlikely place for a faithful follower of God to find provision.

God's provision for Elijah is astounding. Yet the story of the Widow is even better. First Kings 17:9 says, "I have commanded a widow in that place to supply you with food." This widow was a Gentile. She was not a part of the tribes of Israel. She lived in a place that worshipped fickle gods. She was in a place of desperation. When Elijah meets her she is about to prepare the last meal her rations can afford for herself and her son. Can you imagine that? Knowing you can only feed your child one more meal. God spoke to her heart so that when Elijah asked her for bread she said yes. She fed her family and Elijah for "some time". The "jar of flour was not used up and the jug of oil did not run dry." (1 Kings 17:16)

The story doesn't end there. The son of the Widow becomes ill and eventually dies. She believes her own sin must have caused the God of Elijah to kill her son. But God. Elijah carries the boy to the room he was staying in and cries to the Lord three times.

The Lord heard Elijah's cry, and the boy's life returned to him, and he lived. Elijah picked up the child and carried him down from the room into the house. He gave him to his mother and said, "Look, your son is alive!" Then the woman said to Elijah, "Now I know that you are a man of God and that the word of the Lord from your mouth is the truth." 1 Kings 17:22-24

Can you even believe this story?!? Not only did these miraculous things minister to Elijah and prepare him for what was ahead in his life, but it completely changed the lives of this widow and her family. Do you think she ever forgot what God had done for her? For her son? I can tell you she did not. In fact, she probably told everyone that would listen about that time during the drought when the God of Israel fed her and then raised her son from the dead. Do you believe that God can do the same for you? Maybe you are like the widow and God is not what you know. Maybe you have been in church your whole life and heard this story before. God doesn't care which one you are. God cares that you might be willing to give Him a shot. God cares that you step out on a limb and trust Him. God wants you to know Him as Jehovah-jireh, the God who provides. He will meet you where you are.

Those who walk in the darkness cannot see where they are going. Put your trust in the light while there is still time; then you will become children of the light."
