What is it? Guild members bring beauty in and around our church to glorify God. Guild members serve with dedication, reverence, faithfulness and devotion for the love of God and results in a sense of awe, joy, and gratitude to create beauty in our worship services.

How can you serve? Volunteers make floral arrangements in the Chapel, Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall for worship services (primarily greens in the Chapel and Fellowship Hall), break down the arrangements on Monday to deliver to members who are in the hospital, etc. Primary skill is making the flower arrangements; time involved is dependent on needs. During Advent and Lent seasons, special decorations are used.

2. Ushers

What is it? Ushers serve the worship service by handing out church bulletins and greeting people as they arrive, assisting with seating, recording attendance, collecting the offering, directing members during Communion, and working with clergy to help with flow of worship.

How can you serve? Volunteers are organized in December by the chairperson and a schedule is created, giving each volunteer one month to serve. Some act as substitutes to be on-call as needed during the year.

What is it? Communion stewards have the responsibility of overseeing the elements used in the Communion services during worship.

How can you serve? Volunteers prepare the bread and juice for each service and prepare the altar for the elements. Elements are also prepared for our unwillingly absent and are delivered to them.

At the 11:00 a.m. Traditional service, greeters stand at the Sunday School, Chapel and Narthex entrances to hand out bulletins and welcome everyone. At the 9:00 a.m. Contemporary service, greeters also serve as ushers to help with the offering collection.

How can you serve? For the 11:00 a.m. Traditional service, let Larry and Ginger know to put your name on the “once a month” schedule created in December for the next year .Let Mary Lou Jarrell know you are interested in the Contemporary service where volunteers serve on a rotating schedule (usually 4-5 times per year). Commitments are for one year at a time.

What is it? The purpose of the Connect Team (formerly called Evangelism) is to help visitors, once they “get to the sidewalk”, feel welcome and wanted at St. Paul. Christian love is shown by warm verbal welcome in the halls, in the sanctuary, in activities and followed by phone calls and hand written notes.

How can you serve? Volunteers reach out to visitors via phone calls, notes, invitations to SS, Wednesday Night Supper, Bible Studies, worship services, etc.

Those who are unwillingly absent may receive phone calls, visits, birthday cards, notes, poinsettias, and meals on special occasions (Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter). What is it? While the emphasis at St. Paul Preschool is on building character and curiosity, our priority is to teach God's word and how our children can apply it to their lives. We have been an outreach and mission program offered to children two months through four years of age since 1981.

1. Worship and Sermon Graphics
